

St. Baldrick's Foundation and Griffin's Guardians fund life-saving childhood cancer research

CICERO, NY - The <u>St. Baldrick's Foundation</u>, the largest charity funder of <u>childhood cancer</u> <u>research</u> grants, and <u>Griffin's Guardians</u> are proud to announce the St. Baldrick's Scholar Award to Jessica Tsai, M.D., Ph.D. at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute for a span of three years. This grant will support Dr. Tsai's research on pediatric diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma (DIPG).

Dr. Tsai plans to improve outcomes for patients with DIPG by exploring new treatment approaches. Dr. Tsai discovered a gene called FOXR2, which is usually inactive but is highly active in some DIPG cases, leading to rapid tumor growth. FOXR2 can switch on a group of genes called ETS transcription factors, which in turn activate the MAPK signaling pathway—a process not previously observed in DIPGs. Dr. Tsai aims to unravel the precise collaboration between FOXR2 and ETS TFs in activating MAPK signaling, shedding light on the mechanisms driving DIPG progression.

Griffin's Guardian was founded by the Engle family in memory of Griffin Engle, who at the age of 7 passed away from DIPG. DIPG is a type of brain cancer that primarily affects children. It is a highly aggressive and unfortunately, often fatal tumor located in the brainstem, specifically in an area called the pons. DIPG is challenging to treat due to its location and the complex nature of the brainstem.

"We will never say Griffin lost his battle to cancer, but that he won." Said Erin Engle, Griffin's mother. "He won the hearts of so many. He taught us what true strength is, he taught us to never give up, he taught us to keep smiling, and most importantly he taught us love."
